Former English teacher and OneWorld Classrooms' Director Paul Hurteau offers a variety of professional development presentations, workshops and courses that focus on integrating global education, technology and the arts into the K-8 curriculum. Paul has lived, traveled and taught in the Amazon Rain Forest, Africa, the Canadian Arctic, China, Tibet and the Galapagos Islands. He has also visited hundreds of K-12 schools in NY, PA, CT, VA and MA to conduct Arts in Education and professional development programs. In his courses, he models a method through which teachers take their students on dynamic curriculum-focused global explorations that make learning more powerful and meaningful and prepare students for global citizenship.

Global Classroom Connections—In this three-hour course, K-8 teachers explore Internet-based, teacher-monitored programs that connect US students with their overseas peers in the pursuit of curricular objectives.

The Arts, the Internet and the World—In this three or fifteen-hour course, Paul models how K-8 teachers can integrate a variety of arts-based online resources into curriculum-centered global exploration in the classroom.

Poetry Safari—In this three or fifteen-hour course, Paul models a poetry unit that explores world animals — and culminates in a student presentation.

Going Global with Google Earth—In this three or fifteen hour course, K-8 teachers learn how to tap the power of Google Earth to make classroom learning more dynamic and meaningful—in all areas of the curriculum.

Introduction to OneWorld Classrooms —A one-hour primer on how teachers can tap OWC programs to make their curriculum come alive with global connections.
